Dear Friends,

I set out on Sunday morning to make my way to Dublin, to see my aunt who is rapidly coming the end of her earthly life. My aunty Patsy, was like a second mum to me. I was keen to see her before she got too sick. In my haste to get home to Dublin, I didn't take into consideration the storms Isha and Joycelyn and what they might have in store for me. With all the havoc and disruptions they caused they gave me two days of patient waiting in Holyhead Port.

Waiting is a patient endeavour that can evoke a multitude of emotions. It is the act of staying in the moment or situation until a desired outcome or event occurs. It can be an agonising experience, as time seems to slow down and anticipation builds. Waiting requires patience, as it often involves uncertainty and a lack control. It can be so frustrating, causing restlessness and impatience to arise. However, waiting can be an opportunity for reflection and introspection. It allows one to pause, reassess and recalibrate their thoughts and feelings.

Waiting can test one's resilience and perseverance. It requires trust and faith that things will work out in due time. It is a reminder that some things are beyond our control and that we must learn to accept and adapt. This waiting certainly put me to the test. I was asking Jesus, why are you testing me like this? I just need to get home to see my aunt, then I started thinking about other people who are in worse situations than me, but our common link is waiting! The People of Palestine, Yemen, Ukraine, Sudan, homeless, those who have a terminal illness, those who live alone, so many people who are in need of love and a smile, and are waiting for you to come along and tell them its going to be okay, like so many people told me don't worry you will get to Dublin and I did, the wait was worth it! So, while waiting may be difficult, it is a journey that shapes our character and enriches our experiences.
