Dear Friends,

Greetings from the Shrine of Divine Mercy here in beautiful Poland. I have remembered each of you, your families, and loved ones in my time of prayer. To be Ordained to offer the sacrifice of the Eucharist, administer the holy sacraments, and see you grow in your faith and be touched by your holiness humbles me! Who would not want to be a Priest, Religious Sister, or Brother?

Yes, these vocations are not without their problems, and neither is Married Life or Living a Celibate Life! The challenges of life help us to become better members of the body of Christ and enable us to grow into the people that God has called us to be! Young people, what is God calling you to? 
